Rules and Proposed Rules

Survivors Benefit Claims. In this proposed rule the VA is simplifying the application process for survivor benefits for families of deceased veterans. If someone qualifies for dependency and indemnity compensation (DIC), they will not be considered for a survivor's pension. The only exception is for surviving spouses with no dependents, living in a nursing home, and receiving Medicaid, where a survivor's pension might be more helpful. The stated purpose of this change is to speed up claim processing and maximize financial support for veterans' families. Public comments may be made through May 10 and can be submitted here.

Reproductive Health. Final rule effective April 3, 2024. The VA's medical regulations now permit abortion counseling and grant exceptions to the ban on abortions for veterans and CHAMP-VA beneficiaries in cases where there is a threat to the life or health of the patient and in cases of rape or incest.

Access to IVF. Final rule effective March 28, 2024. The VA has expanded IVF benefits to veterans, regardless

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of marital status or ability to use their own eggs or sperm. This follows a change in DoD policy. To qualify, veterans must still have a service-connected disability that prevents them from having children without fertility treatment.

Changes to VASRD for Digestive Conditions. Final rule effective May 19, 2024. The VA is updating its disability rating schedule for digestive conditions. Moving forward, Irritable Bowel Syndrome (IBS) evaluations will use new (Rome IV) criteria, but the maximum rating remains 30%. Crohn's Disease also has revised criteria to reflect symptom severity and treatment impact. Lastly, Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD) is now assessed by measuring the narrowing of the esophagus.

Accelerated Enrollment Under the PACT Act. The VA is accelerating the timeline for healthcare enrollment for toxic-exposed veterans enumerated in the PACT Act. The initial timeline staggered enrollment eligibility, but all of these veterans may now file benefits claims online, by phone, by mail, or in person at a VA medical facility.
